### School Uniform - A reminder

We are seeking the views of parents and carers on the following proposed amendments to the School Uniform Policy.

#### **Trousers**

- We are aware that at times families have found it difficult to source appropriately styled and comfortable dark grey trousers.
- The proposal is to allow students the choice to wear *either* dark grey *or* black trousers [no additional cost].
- As is the case now, all trousers must be plain, straight-leg no flare, drainpipe, skinny, cargo, <u>'leggings-style'</u> or other 'fashion' style.

Please note there is no proposal to allow black skirts to be worn at this time; skirts should continue to be dark grey, pleated only.

### Ties

- The proposal is for the phased introduction of clip-on, ready-tied ties.
- If the proposal goes ahead, it would be the intention of the school to only expect incoming year 7 students (September 2023) to purchase and wear clip-on ties [no additional cost to existing students].
- Note that APC uniform suppliers would phase out their stock of normal ties over the next
   12-18 months at which point only clip-on ties will be available to buy.
- Current year 7-11 students will be able to see out their school years with a choice of clip-on tie or existing tie (while stocks last).

### **Summer Uniform**

We appreciate that during the final half term of the school year, the temperatures of the school building can at times become uncomfortable when wearing the full school uniform, including ties. With this in mind we would like to propose a 'summer uniform' for the students during the final half term (exact dates will be published by the school). The summer uniform would include the following:

- School skirt or school trousers [no additional cost].
- Plain white polo shirt (no logos of any kind) OR white polo shirt with TGS logo on it (school PE uniform) [no additional cost].
- School shoes and socks or tights [no additional cost].

Please note there is no proposal to bring in school shorts at this time.

Your views and feedback would be greatly appreciated. Please could I ask you to <u>complete this google form</u> in order to record your views on these proposals. **The deadline for feedback is TOMORROW, Friday 17th March 2023.** We will report back to you soon and publicise a launch date if appropriate.

# **Uniform Standards: Jewellery**

Some of our students are choosing to wear jewellery that is not permitted in school. Ideally no jewellery should be worn.

The main issue is earrings. In several subject areas hoop earrings or similar can cause a safety risk. We also do not want students to lose their jewellery in school. Please could I ask for your support to ensure your child follows the school guidance:

A watch, single plain, flat ring (1 max) and a single pair of plain ear studs (not hoops/rings/flesh tunnels) can be worn, one in each ear lobe. No other items must be visible.

Ideally no facial make-up; where this is worn, it should be very light and discreet.

Bracelets are not to be worn.

Nose piercings should not be worn. If students do have this piercing, then it must be removed for the school day.

Tongue piercings, facial jewellery or similar body piercings must never be worn. Any new piercings/flesh tunnel procedures that require a 'healing period' should only take place during school holidays that are long enough to accommodate this healing process. All piercings (other than ear piercing as stated above) must be removed and not simply covered up with plasters during school time.

No jewellery should be worn during physical education or other practical activities. This includes all earrings.

Clear nail varnish is permitted. Coloured nail varnish and false nails\* are not allowed.

(\* this includes acrylic/gel nails, nail extensions, nail art and similar)
